## Tobacco Free Rhode Island General Updates: Dan Fitzgerald

- □ Built partnership w/ CVS Health and obtained funding for:
  - □ Host school administration training
  - □ Printing of durable smoke-free schools signage for all RI schools
  - □ Creation of a youth focused social marketing campaign on ENDS products
  - □ Research and creation of a best practice (recommendation for enforcing the smoke-free schools policy)
- □ TFRI at a national level this year:
  - □ ASTHO national webinar presentation with Director of DOH & Eileen Boone of CVS
  - □ SADD National Conference in DC
- □ Currently in year 5 of 5 of our grant with the DOH; we've had this grant for 3 cycles (15 years)
- □ Professional development
  - Modeling Youth Advisory Board to not only develop tobacco advocates but also to develop transferable skills that they can use in the workforce and beyond
  - □ Hired paid intern for 28 hours per week this summer and hope to keep on board throughout the school year
- □ Presentations/Conference:
  - □ Addressing E-Cigarette Use in Schools 368 people
    - □ High school students, college students (at RIC, Bryant, Roger Williams, and Brown), student assistance counselors, school administrators, etc.
      - □ YAB Advocacy 101 at the State House 8 students
  - □ This is Our Year Conference 152 students and 65 adults
  - □ Overview of TFRI and Advocacy Opportunity 269 people

- □ CASS Rounds at Brown University 60 people
- □ 81 current TFRI Network Partner Organizations
- □ Average of 467.5 people on our website each month
  - □ On average 191 people are first time users each month
- □ 691 people on the E-newsletter distribution list and receive two E-newsletters each month
  - □ On average 748 people each month read one of both newsletters

### Policy Workgroup: Megan Tucker & Kristen Westmoreland

- □ Overview of progress:
  - □ The workgroup crafted elevator pitches for each of the three policy priority areas
  - □ Provided feedback for the creation of 5 Factsheets
    - $\hfill\square$  Need to be edited
    - □ Possibly hold some back due to recent affairs
  - $\hfill\square$  Provided feedback for the creation of Letter to the Editor templates
  - □ Challenges:
    - □ TFRI does not have a policy agenda and needs to remain neutral and only present the facts and create tools to assist network partners
    - □ With current local policy landscape, some of the factsheet topic areas needed to be halted.
    - **□** Technical difficulty with access to the fact sheet editable files
- □ Next steps
  - $\hfill\square$  Next meeting:
    - □ August 2<sup>nd</sup> from 1-2:30 @American Heart Association
  - □ Virtually, the group has created a list of priority areas they would like to focus on for the year to come
  - □ At the 8/2/18 meeting the group will discuss readiness and capacity to impact change around each potential priority topic area

#### Cessation workgroup: Carolyn James

- □ Overview of progress:
  - □ Workgroup membership worked to pull together list of cessation resources
    - □ Smaller group of members met virtually to put the resources together into a one-page document
    - □ The group voted and tweaked the resource virtually
    - □ Iteration 1 of this resources and distribution has started
  - □ Workgroup provided input into dissemination plan for the DOH / BHDDH SIM project's tobacco treatment coverage documents
- □ Next steps
  - □ Next meeting:
    - □ Tuesday, August 21, 2018 from 2:30 4:00 @Warwick Public Library
  - □ The workgroup has discussed the need for more population specific cessation resources
    - □ For example for the homeless population
- □ The workgroup discussed the need for a cessation basics presentation so that people who are not treatment specialists can build a better understanding of how cessation

#### Strategic Development workgroup: Astrid Meijer & Shannon Spurlock

- □ Overview of progress:
  - □ The workgroup transitioned from the "Structure and Purpose Workgroup" to their focus on Strategic Development after the creation of the steering committee.
  - □ Discussed the importance of developing the network through networking, trainings, funding, etc.
  - □ Began working on a "spheres of influence" exercise to map out relationships and the influence people in our network have on others to forward the mission of partners and of TFRI.
  - □ Worked with ALA (TFRI fiduciary) to get concrete answers around ability to fundraise, text exempt status, etc.

#### Youth Advisory Board: Zoe Moreau

- □ Held conference
  - □ Feb 2nd @RIC with 150 teens and 50 adults in attendance
  - □ Workshop/exercises included:
    - $\Box$  energizers
    - □ teambuilding with cameras
    - $\hfill\square$  tobacco education
    - □ activism 101
- □ Zombie Walk:
  - □ April 3rd in Providence
  - □ Hosted 100+ students
  - $\hfill\square$  Zoe & Kennedy led the walk
  - □ Mission:
    - □ T21, ecigs added to smoke free policies, banning flavors
  - $\hfill\square$  End of the walk was at the State House
- □ ACS Day at the State House:
  - □ YAB members spoke on behalf of ACS
    - □ addressed more funding for tobacco control
    - $\hfill\square$  helped pass a bill on teen tanning
    - $\hfill\square$  spoke about prevention work at the town level
- □ 21 Reasons Day at the State House
  - □ 21 students from around RI wrote reason why they think the tobacco sale age should be raised from 18 to 21

- Gathered at State House to read off reasons on May 8th
- □ Spoke w/ legislators about T21
- □ SADD National fully funded by SADD National to attend
  - □ Traveled to Washington DC at the end of June
  - □ Attended workshops, Met with legislators
  - Dan, Hanna & Zoe presented workshop about the dangers of e-cigs and what RI is doing to prevent them
- □ Next steps:
  - $\hfill\square$  Youth to Youth w/ 22 students
  - □ Y2Y participants with become part of Youth Advisory Board
  - □ Working w/ CVS Health to develop an ENDS focused social media campaign
  - □ Plan statewide event or conference for the year to come
    - □ discussion on a "thank you" event in honor of our partners and individuals who've made so much possible for our work to be done
